
Thank you to all our clubs who continually find ways to make a difference with "Flower Power".

Many of our clubs provide insurance for their members/events through GCNJ. It is provided by Arthur J. Gallagher & Co. at a cost of \$5.00 per member. Our agent is Joanie Silver <u>Joanic Silver@aig.com</u>.

Questions frequently arise concerning the insurance. From our agent: The intent of the policy is to cover the premise and club members for property and liability. The intent is to cover small events at or near the insured's premises as it involves the insured and its members. While it is not excluded on the policy specifically, the intent is not for bus trips into NYC for non-members. If your dues are not paid to GCNJ you will not be able to obtain certificates of insurance, in essence there will be no coverage.

To request a certificate- send to <u>certrequests@aig.com</u>. Turn around time is 24 hours from receipt of request. If your request is urgent, please indicate as "Rush" to receive within 1 hour

Suggestions on how to keep our earth healthy:


- Buy Locally and Organically Grown Produce. It can take 1 gallon of gasoline for 30 pounds of food shipped across the country to reach your shopping cart.




